The Spotted Lanternfly (SLF), Lycorma delicatula, is a new invasive insect that has spread throughout southeastern Pennsylvania since it's discovery in Berks County in 2014. SLF presents a significant threat to Pennsylvania agriculture, including the grape, tree fruit, hardwood and nursery industries, which collectively are worth nearly \$18 billion to the state's economy. At this meeting, you will learn more about this invasive pest, and how you can help control the impact to your community through the different stages of its life cycle.
